Restoration of Native Species and Their Habitats

- Habitat enhancement projects
 - Removal of "Loss of Fish and Wildlife Habitat" BUI
 - Removal of exotic plant species (DRIWR)
 - Long-term monitoring and evaluation of restoration efforts
- Target Fauna
 - Lake Sturgeon
 - Northern Madtom
 - Coregonines
 - Mussels
 - Other important native sport fishes



Restoration of Native Species and Their Habitats

- Prevention and early detection of aquatic invasive species
 - Developing and implementing an early detection monitoring program
 - Rapid response plans
 - Increase public awareness
 - Sea lamprey
- Maintain existing habitats
 - Blue water bridge lake sturgeon spawning area
