1993 vs. 2011**

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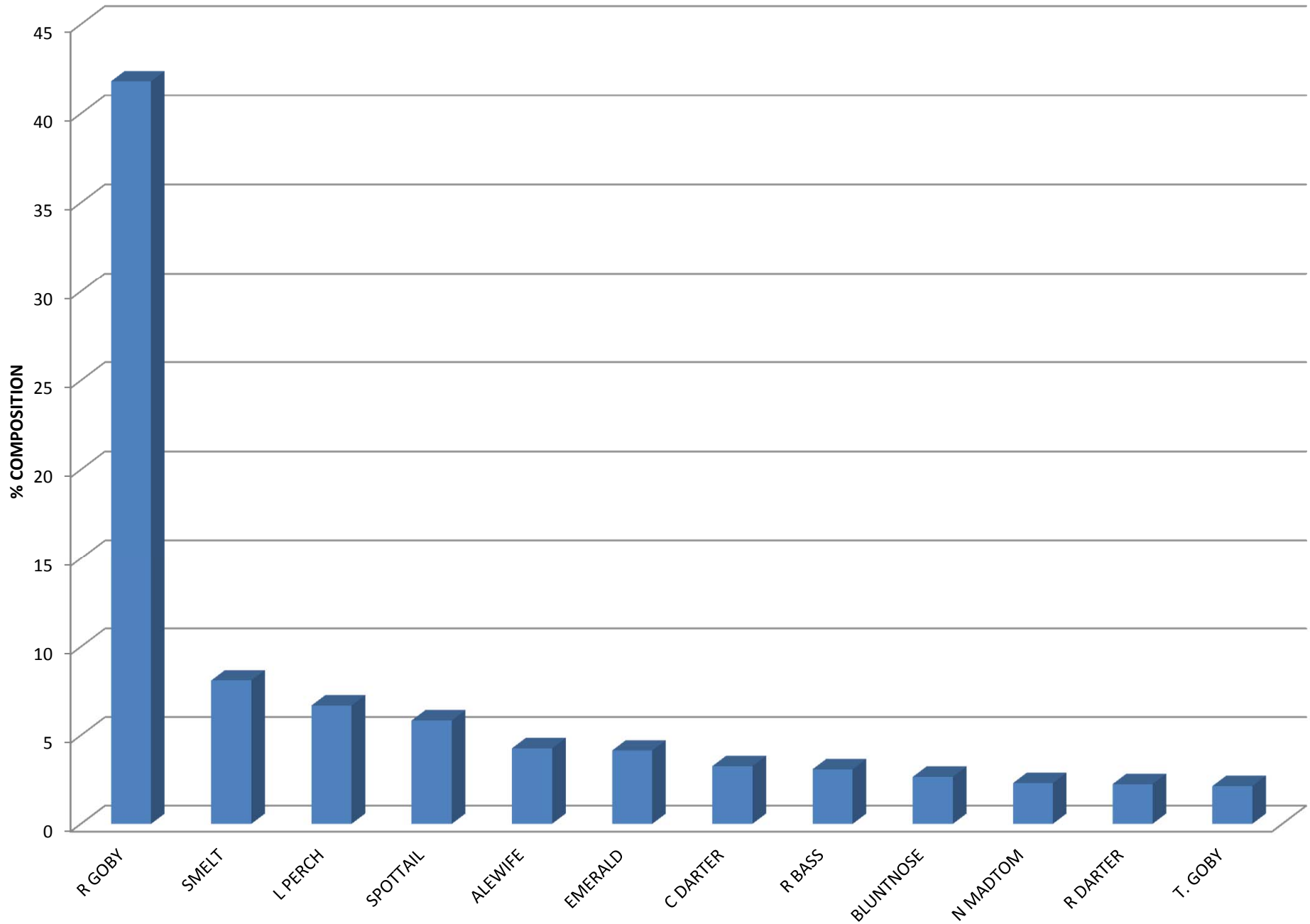
OBJECTIVES

- Determine if introduction of round and tubenose gobies had detrimental effects on benthic species
- Emphasis on darters, madtoms, logperch
- Round gobies first found in 1990 in St. Clair River

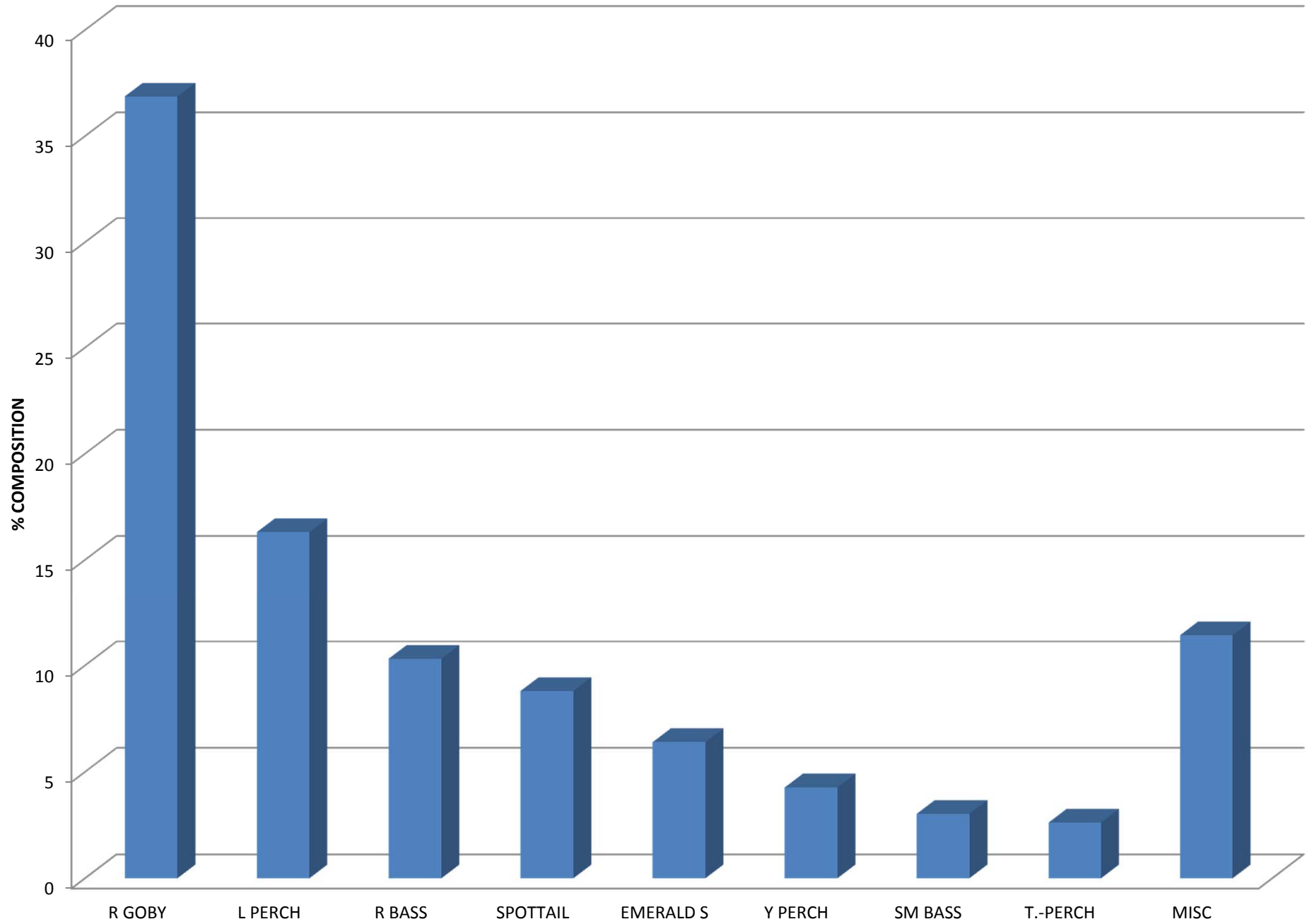
METHODS

- Seining in nearshore
- Trawling at 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11 m
- Day and night
- April-December 1993
- Spring, summer, and fall 2011
